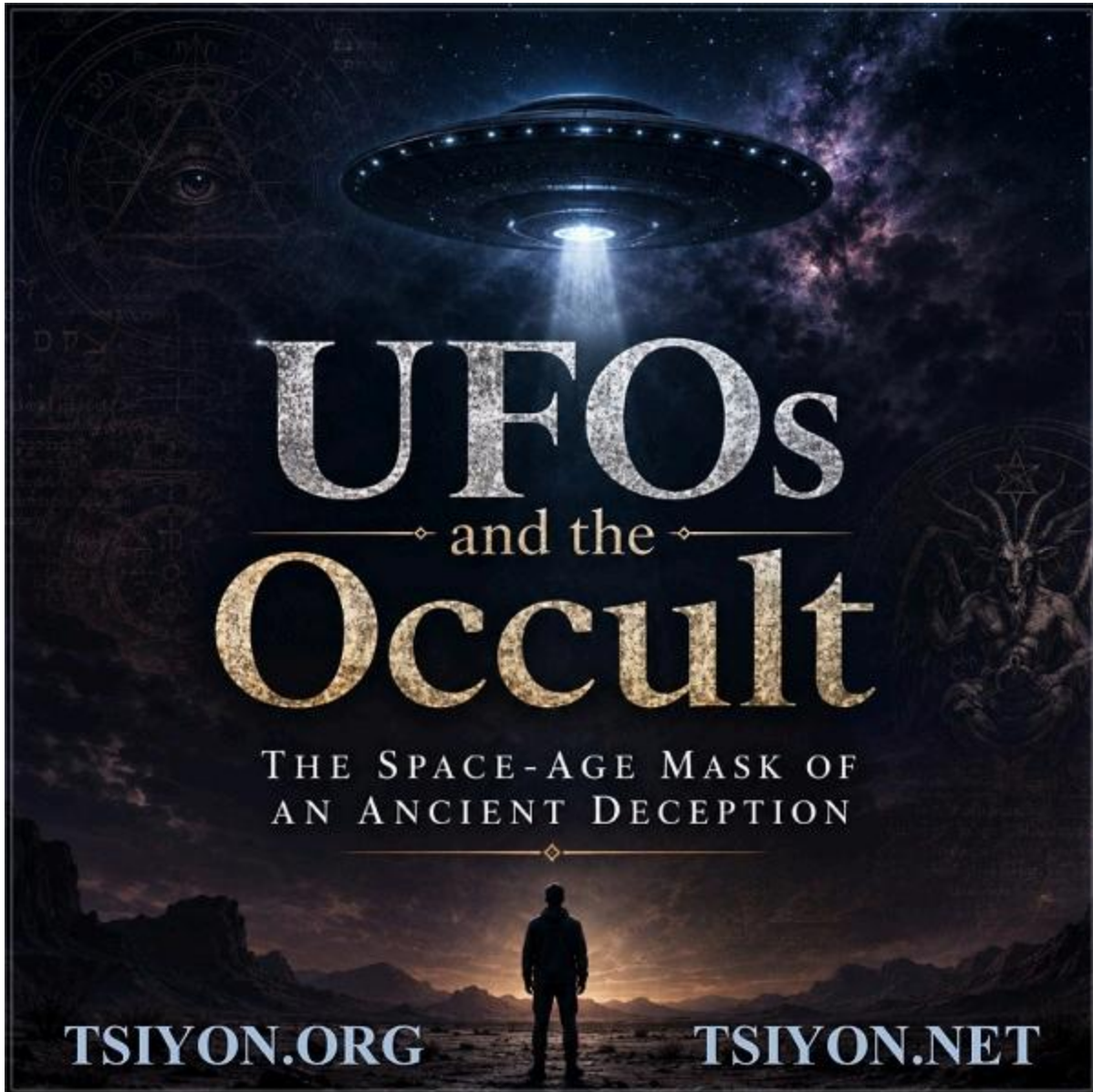

UFOs: Space-Age Mask of an Ancient Deception

Rather suddenly "Disclosure" appears to be imminent. For the first time the idea of extra-terrestrial beings visiting earth is being legitimized in the public

consciousness by mainstream news organizations and even government figures. This newsletter is the first in a ten part series that will unpack the facts, and expose the spiritual implications of this ongoing mind-altering media campaign.

Part 1: UFO Does Not Mean Alien

When most people hear the word “UFO,” they immediately think of aliens. A strange light moves across the night sky. A pilot reports an object he cannot identify. A military video shows something unusual moving in a way that seems difficult to explain. The public hears the story and almost instantly the same question appears: “Are we being visited by beings from another planet?” But that connection is not proof. It is interpretation.

A UFO is simply an unidentified flying object. The newer term, UAP, is often used now because it is broader: unidentified anomalous phenomenon. Either way, the word “unidentified” means exactly that. It means the observer, investigator, camera, radar system, or agency has not yet identified what was seen. It does not mean “alien spacecraft.”

That distinction is important. For decades, popular culture has trained people to make a leap from “unidentified” to “extraterrestrial.” Movies, television, books, documentaries, interviews, and government rumors have all worked together to build a mythology in the public mind. We have been taught to imagine that strange things in the sky are visitors from distant worlds.

Even scientists have contributed to the idea that there must be intelligent life on many planets throughout the universe. For example, we have this quote from the famous Stephen Hawking: "Considering the number of planets and stars that we know exist, it's extremely unlikely that we are the only form of evolved life."

This sounds persuasive because the numbers are so large. But the argument assumes what has not been proven: that life naturally arises from nonliving matter when the conditions appear suitable. Yet scientific literature admits: "The emergence of life from nonlife, or abiogenesis, remains a fundamental question in scientific inquiry." <https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/39159441/>

Without proof that life can spring from nonlife, the vastness of the universe does not prove the abundance of life, the Drake Equation notwithstanding. We should not be quick to accept the interpretation handed to us by popular culture or from

wishful thinking with no basis in fact - even if coming from famous scientists. As NASA has stated: "...extraterrestrial presence on regular display is, of course, a fiction. No life beyond Earth has ever been found; there is no evidence that alien life has ever visited our planet. It's all a story."

So when it comes to UFOs a Bible believer should ask better questions. What was actually seen? What is documented? What is being assumed? What message is attached to the event? And most importantly: what spirit is behind that message?

The Modern Flying-Saucer Age

The modern UFO age is usually traced to 1947, when pilot Kenneth Arnold reported seeing nine strange objects near Mount Rainier. His description helped give the public the phrase "flying saucer." From there, the flying-saucer idea exploded into the public imagination.

This does not mean nothing strange was ever reported before 1947. It means that 1947 became the beginning of the modern UFO mythology: flying discs, government secrecy, crashed saucers, alien visitors, contactees, and later, abductions. Once that mythology took hold, people were given a ready-made explanation for the unknown. If something strange appeared in the sky, the question was no longer simply, "What was that?"

The question became, "Was that an alien spacecraft?"

That is a very different question. It already assumes the most sensational possibility.

The Distance Problem

There is also a major practical problem with the extraterrestrial explanation: distance. We do not live in a Star Trek universe. The stars are not nearby. Even the nearest star systems are unimaginably distant by human travel standards.

The closest known exoplanet often discussed in relation to possible habitability is Proxima Centauri b, orbiting the nearest star system beyond our own. It is about 4.2 light-years away. A light-year is not a measure of time. It is the distance light travels in one year - about 5.88 TRILLION miles. That means even the nearest candidate world is more than TWENTY-FOUR TRILLION MILES AWAY. At known

spacecraft speeds, the trip would take thousands of years or longer. What craft could be built that would even function that long? What about food and supplies? What about radiation and other space hazards? How could generations of people be sustained over many generations in a glorified tin can? The entire idea is an obvious fiction.

The real facts being what they are, we should be very cautious about assuming that beings from other star systems are routinely visiting earth, entering our atmosphere, hovering near military bases, abducting people, and delivering messages to contactees, as if the closest earth-like planet is right next door. It's not. Yes, people are seeing unidentified objects in the sky, but it does not naturally follow that they are from anywhere but here.

What Do Official Reports Actually Say?

In recent years, the subject of UAPs has moved from fringe discussion into official government reporting. That is significant. Military pilots, radar systems, intelligence agencies, and congressional committees have taken the matter seriously enough to study it. But official interest does not equal proof of aliens.

In fact, public government reports have been cautious. Some cases remain unresolved. Some are explained as balloons, drones, aircraft, atmospheric effects, sensor errors, or insufficient data. Others remain unidentified because the evidence is too limited to make a confident judgment. That is not the same thing as saying, "They are from another planet." It simply means there are things people have not identified.

The wise response is neither gullibility nor mockery. We should not laugh at every witness - they probably saw something. But neither should we accept the alien interpretation simply because the event is strange. A Bible believer should be able to say: "Yes, something may have been seen. But no, that does not mean the explanation is extraterrestrial." This is where discernment begins.

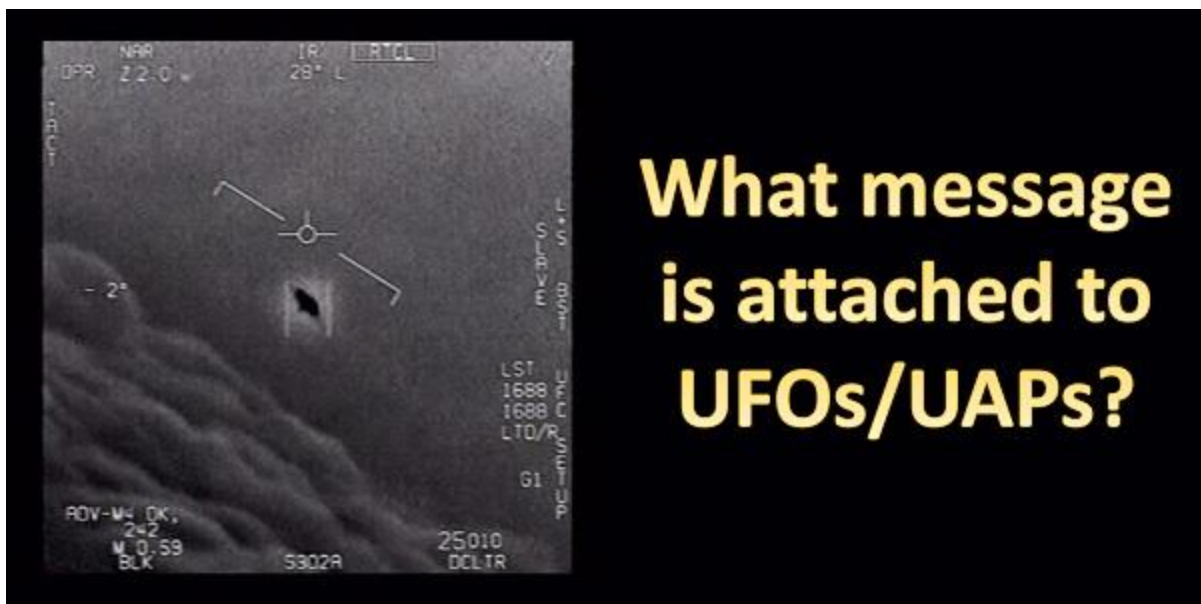
Other Possibilities

If UAP does not automatically mean alien, then what else might be involved? There are several possibilities. Some sightings may be natural phenomena: stars, planets, meteors, unusual clouds, lightning-related effects, atmospheric reflections, or other sky events. Some may be ordinary human technology: aircraft, drones, balloons, satellites, rockets, flares, or experimental equipment. Some may be secret human technology. Governments have always developed

weapons, aircraft, surveillance platforms, and electronic systems in secrecy. It would be naive to think the public knows everything being tested in the sky.

Some sightings may involve psychological or perceptual factors. People can misjudge distance, speed, size, and altitude, especially at night or under stress. Cameras and sensors can also create misleading impressions. Some sightings may involve deception. A strange event can be used to manipulate public belief, cover classified technology, or prepare people to accept a larger narrative.

Finally, some may involve spiritual realities. The unseen realm is real. There are spiritual powers that deceive. There are forbidden forms of contact. There are signs and wonders that are not from God. We should all be aware of this. This does not mean every strange light is a demon. That would be careless. But it does mean Bible believers must not let modern language blind us to ancient patterns of deception. This is key.



The Main Question Is Not “Are UFOs Real?”

People often ask, “Do you believe in UFOs?” That is not the best question. If UFO simply means “unidentified flying object,” then of course there are UFOs. People see things they cannot identify. Pilots, soldiers, police officers, ordinary citizens, and cameras have all recorded things that were, at least for a time, unidentified.

The better question is: “What are we being taught to believe about them?”

That question moves us from objects to interpretation. It moves us from sky phenomena to the world we live in. It moves us from “what was seen?” to “what message is attached to it?”

That is where the danger lies. The public mythology surrounding UFOs often says: Nonhuman intelligences are above us. They are more advanced than us. They may have created us or guided our development. They may know our future. They may be here to help mankind evolve. They may one day reveal the truth about our origins. They may require mankind to unite under a new planetary order.

That is not merely a theory about objects in the sky. That is a religious framework. It offers a different creation story, a different revelation, a different hope, and potentially a different savior. It is another gospel. (See Galatians 1:8)

The Bible Tells Us to Test the Spirits

Scripture does not tell us to accept every supernatural claim. It tells us to test. “Beloved, don’t believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world.” 1 John 4:1

That instruction is vital. The issue is not whether a claim is impressive. The issue is whether it is true and whether it comes from God. Yeshua warned: “For there will arise false messiahs, and false prophets, and they will show great signs and wonders, so as to lead astray, if possible, even the chosen ones.” Matthew 24:24

Notice that deception does not come only through weak arguments. It may come with signs and wonders. It may be spectacular. It may be persuasive. It may appear in the language of light, knowledge, salvation, unity, and peace. Paul also warned that Satan disguises himself: “And no wonder, for even Satan masquerades as an angel of light.” 2 Corinthians 11:14

That verse is vital in our age. Deception does not always look dark. Sometimes it appears as enlightenment. Sometimes it comes dressed in the language of progress. Sometimes it claims to bring mankind into a higher understanding. In the modern world, that “angel of light” may not appear with wings and a harp. He may appear as a messenger from the stars.

Why This Series?

This series is not written to prove or disprove every UFO story. Some stories are uncertain. Some are false. Some are exaggerated. Some are misunderstood. Some may have natural or technological explanations. We do not need to prove every story to see the pattern.

Again and again, the UFO phenomenon points people toward hidden knowledge, nonhuman guides, altered origins, cosmic salvation, and new revelation beyond Scripture. That is the pattern we must examine.

The old occult world spoke of spirits, ascended masters, hidden adepts, secret wisdom, and forbidden knowledge. The modern UFO world often speaks of extraterrestrials, interdimensional beings, higher intelligences, cosmic teachers, and disclosure. The language has changed. But the spiritual pattern is familiar. It is the old occult world wearing a space-age mask.

A Careful Starting Point

So we begin with a simple but necessary correction: UFO does not mean alien. UAP does not mean extraterrestrial. Unidentified does not mean “from another planet.” Before Bible believers accept the alien interpretation, we should ask: Is this natural? Is this man-made? Is this technological? Is this psychological? Is this deceptive? Is this spiritual?

And above all: Does the message attached to this phenomenon lead people to YHWH, His Messiah, His Word, repentance, obedience, and truth? Or does it lead them to a false authority?

That is the test.

In my next newsletter in this series, we will look at something many people do not know: the strange sky stories did not begin with flying saucers in 1947. Long before the saucer age, newspapers reported mysterious “airships” moving across the skies. That older wave shows us something important: the phenomenon seems to change its appearance according to the imagination of the age. Before flying saucers, there were mystery airships. And that is where the pattern begins. We will consider that and move forward from there.

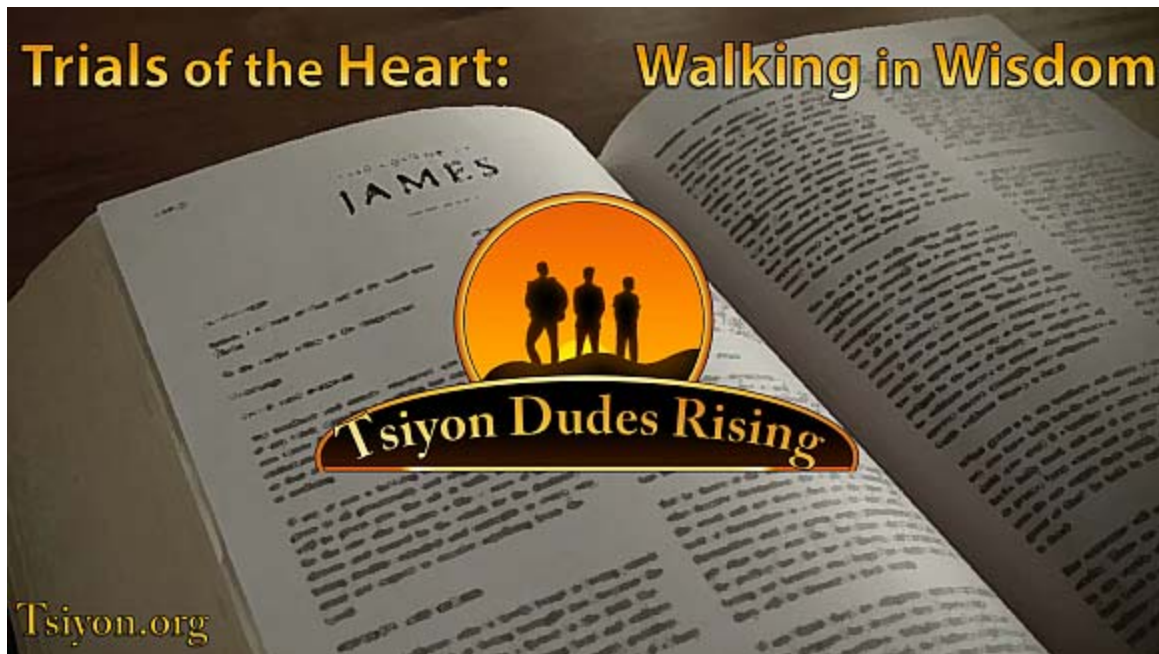
